

NACCRRRA Child Care Programs

Operation Military Child Care (OMCC) is for Families of:

Service members with orders in support of one of the following Deployments:

- Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF)
- Operation Enduring Freedom (OEF)
- Global War on Terror (GWOT)
- Oversees Contingency Operations
- Operation Noble Eagle
- Army Recruiters

For married Service members, the spouse must be working, looking for work or attending school. The same policies will apply to unmarried legal parents living in the same household.

Eligible Families receive:

- Help finding approved* child care in your community
- Fee assistance to help cover part of the cost of child care
- Contact Child Care Aware® at 1-800-424-2246 for a personal consultation
- Search online for providers already pre-qualified to serve Army Families in your area
- Sponsors with military orders in support of a deployment may temporarily receive fee assistance for licensed case during the period of deployment at www.naccrra.org. However, fee assistance will be discontinued 60 days following return from deployment unless children are moved to an accredited child care provider. Initial selection of an accredited child care provider will prevent the necessity to change providers at a later date.

*Approved OMCC providers must meet all requirements. The provider must have state child care license and have received an inspection within the last 12 months. Because licensing requirements vary widely by state, you may also contact Child Care Aware® at 1-800-424-2246 for more information.

Military Child Care in Your Neighborhood (MCCYN) is for Families of:

Active Duty Service members
Active Guard Reserve Service members
Army Civilians

Fee assistance to help cover part of the cost of child care

The Wounded, Ill or Injured Program is for Families of:

Service members who are assigned to a Warriors in Transition Battalion or Unit
Active-Duty Service members who have been injured and are receiving in-patient or out-patient medical care for extended periods

Eligibility for services is based on need and is determined on a case by case basis. Please contact us at 1-800-424-2246 for a sensitive, personal consultation.

Eligible Families receive:

Help finding approved* child care providers in your community

Fee assistance to help cover the cost of regular child care for up to 6 months during recuperation
(extensions beyond 6 months will be considered based on physician reassessment)

Free care for medical and therapy appointments

The Survivors of Fallen Warriors Program is for Families of:

Service members who died on Active Duty on or after September 11, 2001

Eligible Families receive:

Help finding approved high-quality* child care in your community

Fee assistance to help cover part of the cost of child care

Search online for providers in your area that already have completed the subsidy application at www.naccrra.org . If you don't see your selected provider on this list, they may still be eligible.

Free Respite Child Care

The United States Army Child, Youth & School Services (CYSS) is making Respite Child Care services available for you. Respite Child Care will provide your family with up to 16 hours of free child care* each month for each of your eligible children. You can use this time to run errands, attend appointments, or just take some well-deserved time out for yourself. NACCRRRA will reimburse your provider for eligible care at the Army approved hourly rate. Eligible child care providers will be reimbursed at a maximum of \$10/hour for the first child and \$5 for each additional child, not to exceed \$20/hour per family.

The Army recognizes the challenges and extraordinary stress you and your family may be experiencing.

The Army wants to help support you in meeting your unique child care needs.

To take advantage of the Respite Child Care, you or your spouse need only be an Army Service Member in one of the following categories:

Mission Level 1 and 2 - Eligible for up to 16 hours/child/month

Deployed - (for 30 days prior and 90 days after return)

Temporary Change of Station

Unaccompanied Permanent Change of Station

TDY (90-179 days)

Wounded, Ill, and Injured

Survivors of Fallen Service members

Spouse does not have to be working, looking for work or in school to qualify. If you are currently receiving assistance through NACCRRRA and intend to use your current provider for respite care, you will need to submit your orders.

Must submit the following documents:

Parent Child Care Respite Application

Service member's Orders

Parent Self Certification Statement or copy of child's birth certificate

Provider documents

State licensed and annually inspected child care home or center

Payment Rules

Not a substitute for regularly scheduled care

May be used at the discretion of the parent

Cannot be used in conjunction with installation respite to exceed authorized monthly hours-Parents sign agreement to this effect

Providers will be reimbursed up to \$10/hour for the first child and \$5 for each additional child, not to exceed \$20/hour per family

Must be used in at least 2 hour increments

Monthly attendance sheet to be verified by parent and provider
